TELEVISION BROADCAST TEAM



Dave Leno, Play-by-Play: Leno is entering his 3rd season as the TV PxP Voice of the Riptide. In addition to his lacrosse work, he's a broadcaster with the Philadelphia Union (MLS), hosting pregame, halftime and postgame shows and calling select matches on TV & radio play-by-play. This past month, he announced all 31 matches at the 2021 World Team Tennis season in Indian Wells, CA; and worked the US OPEN Tennis Championships in New York as a TV World Feed and Radio commentator. Additionally, Leno freelances with ESPN as a college football and basketball announcer throughout the year. He got his start on National TV at 21-years-old on the Big Ten Network. Soon after, he called TV games with Comcast Sports Southeast, One World Sports and USA Field Hockey, in addition to being the Voice of several minor league teams.



Mitch Belisle, Color Analyst: Belisle is a former professional lacrosse player who spent nine seasons in the NLL (2008-2017), where he played for the New York Titans (drafted 13th overall), Boston Blazers, and the Minnesota/Georgia Swarm, winning an NLL Championship in 2017. Belisle also played 12 seasons in Major League Lacrosse (2007-2018) where he won the 2011 MLL Championship and was a member of Team USA both on the indoor (2011) and outdoor National teams (2014). Belisle was a 2X All-American and NCAA Division 1 Defenseman of the Year in 2007 for Cornell University before embarking on his professional career. He started his broadcasting career with the Georgia Swarm during the 2017-2018 season and served as the Color Analyst for the Riptide during the 2019-20 and 2021-22 seasons. Currently, Belisle is a partner at Trilogy Lacrosse, one of the premier lacrosse event operators in the US.



Grant DelVecchio, Sideline Reporter: DelVecchio is a recent graduate of the University of Notre Dame, where as a student he broadcasted over 60 live events streamed on ESPN Plus and the ACC Network Extra for nine different Fighting Irish athletic teams. Since graduating, Grant has served as both a play-by-play voice and color commentator for Fordham University football and basketball games on SNY and ESPN+, as well as soccer and volleyball games on ESPN3 and ESPN+ for Iona University. This past summer, Grant was one of the lead play-by-play voices for The Lacrosse Network's coverage of the 2022 World Lacrosse Men's U21 World Championship hosted in Limerick, Ireland

RADIO BROADCAST TEAM



Peter Schwartz, Play by Play: Schwartz currently serves as a host and anchor for WFAN Radio in New York while also serving an update anchor for CBS Sports Radio. He also covers the Islanders for WFAN.com and is a Play by Play Announcer for Varsity Media Sports Network. Schwartz spent eight years as the radio play by play voice for the New York Dragons of the Arena Football League. He was also the radio play by play announcer for the XFL's NY/NJ Hitmen in 2001 and the radio play by play announcer for the New York Saints of the Major Indoor Lacrosse League from 1993 to 1996.

Hofstra Students, Color Analyst: A rotating lineup of Hofstra students / WRHU staff members will serve as color analysts for Riptide games throughout the season. WRHU also produces and distributes live game broadcasts for the New York Islanders, Long Island Nets and Long Island Ducks.





EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT, GF SPORTS AND ENTERTAINMENT THIRD SEASON

Rich Lisk is the Executive Vice President of GF Sports and Entertainment and joined in January 2020. In his role, Lisk oversees all lacrosse and business operations for the New York Riptide of the National Lacrosse League (NLL), and provides sales, marketing and operations leadership across GF Sports' portfolio of live sports and entertainment properties. Lisk has more than 25 years of experience in the

sports industry and was named an NLL Executive of the Year Finalist for the 2021-22 Season. Prior to joining GF Sports and Entertainment, he was General Manager for the New England Black Wolves (NLL). During his tenure, the team went to the playoffs four consecutive seasons and Inside Lacrosse recognized Lisk as its 2016 General Manager of the Year for his work. In addition to his time in the NLL, Lisk was a General Manager of the Philadelphia Soul (AFL) and President and General Manager of the East Coast Hockey League's Trenton Titans, an affiliate of the Philadelphia Flyers (NHL). Lisk is a graduate of Rutgers University.







GENERAL MANAGER SECOND SEASON

Jim Veltman was announced as the second General Manager in franchise history on July 10, 2020.

Arguably the best defenseman in National Lacrosse League history, Veltman was inducted into the NLL Hall of Fame in 2009 following a 16-year career that saw him win eight championships. He began his career in 1992 with the Buffalo Bandits when the league was the MILL, winning three titles with the club and was also a member of the only undefeated season in MILL/NLL history in 1993. Veltman was selected

first overall in the NLL expansion draft in 1998 by the Ontario Reign, which would become the Toronto Rock in 1999. With the Rock, Veltman served as captain for 10 seasons and led the team to Champions Cups in 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003 and 2005.

Veltman retired at the end of the 2008 season, wrapping up a career filled with both personal and team accolades. In addition to his eight titles, Veltman was the inaugural recipient of the NLL Sportsmanship Award in 2002 and added a league MVP to his resume in 2004. He led the league in loose balls in 14 of his 16 seasons and still holds the Bandits record for loose balls in a game with 29 in addition to the NLL playoff record in that category. He is second in career loose balls, just surpassed earlier this year by Brodie Merrill, and holds the single-season NLL record with 226 set in 2006. In 2003, he served as the captain of Team Canada's gold medal winning team at the inaugural FIL World Indoor Championships.

Named an assistant for the Ajax-Pickering Rock just two weeks after retirement, Veltman also saw action behind the bench for the Rock as assistant under Glenn Clark for the 2009 season. He served as the head coach of the Czech Republic team at the 2011 FIL World Indoor Lacrosse Championships before spending two seasons, 2016 and 2017, behind the bench with Clark again in the NLL, this time as the defensive coordinator with the New England Black Wolves.





LADOUGEUR

HEAD COACH SECOND SEASON

Dan Ladouceur was named the second Head Coach in franchise history on July 10, 2020.

Ladouceur joined the Riptide after spending the last four seasons as the offensive coordinator with the Georgia Swarm. In his first season behind the bench in Georgia, the Swarm set a new NLL record for the most goals scored with 266 and captured the Champions Cup. The Thunder Bay,

Ontario native spent 11 seasons in the NLL with the Toronto Rock as a defenseman, 10 of which he was teammates with Riptide General Manager Jim Veltman.

The six-foot-six Ladouceur captured five Champions Cups while a member of the Rock and wrapped up his career with 16 points and 232 loose balls as well as 428 penalty minutes. His penalty minute total is the second-most in Rock team history. Following his playing career, Ladouceur spent five seasons behind the bench for the Rock, serving as the defensive coordinator, and helped lead the team to the Champions Cup appearance in 2015. In addition to his coaching duties, Ladouceur also serves as a sergeant for the Toronto Police Service in Ontario.









OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR SECOND SEASON

Jason Crosbie was named the Riptide Offensive Coordinator on July 28, 2020. Crosbie, selected 24th overall in the 1998 NLL draft by the Ontario Raiders, spent 11 seasons in the league. He wrapped up his career with 397 points on 142 goals and 255 assists in 134 games and was an All-Star reserve in 2009. He also won three Mann Cup titles during his Major Series Lacrosse (MSL) career. Crosbie began his coaching career in 2003 with the Clarington Green Gaels and won two Founder's Cups behind the bench with them. He then moved to Ontario Series Lacrosse with the Merchants Lacrosse Club and spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach in MSL with the Brooklin Redmen. Crosbie has also been the offensive coordinator of the Israeli men's indoor team since 2015, which placed fourth in that years FIL World Indoor Championships and fifth in the 2019 edition. In 2017, Israel captured a gold medal at the ELF European Box Lacrosse Championships.





DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR SECOND SEASON

Pat Jones was named the Riptide Defensive Coordinator on July 28, 2020. Jones spent nine seasons in the NLL, seeing action in 102 games. In his career he had two goals and 33 assists for 35 points while also recording 60 penalty minutes and 449 loose ball pickups. At the face-off dot, he went 1247-of-2556, winning 48.8% of his attempts. Jones assisted Ladouceur during the Pee Wee National Box Lacrosse Championships and he has also coached in the Oshawa Minor Lacrosse Association.





GOALIE COACH SECOND SEASON

Dineley previously served as Goalie Coach for Team Canada at the 2016 and 2012 U19 Men's World Championships. Dineley also is an Assistant Coach with St. Michaels High School in Toronto, ON. A goalie during his playing days, Dineley suited up for Team Canada at the 2010 and 2014 Men's World Championships, as well as the 2012 Duel in Denver. He also played seven career NLL games, all coming in 2013 for the Philadelphia Wings. Dineley was twice named to the MAAC All-Academic Team while playing for Canisius College.
